Many of us were honored to participate in Veterans Day activities this month, including the 1st Annual Veterans Walk in Hilo, presenting flowers at the 25th Anniversary of the Vietnam Memorial in Hilo, the Veterans ceremony with the 1st Squadron, 299th Cavalry Regiment Memorial Service at KMR, presenting flowers at the Veterans Day ceremony at the Veterans Cemetery, and the Veterans Day ceremony and dinner at Kilauea Military Camp.

Distinguished Citizen Medal - Norman Stahl, representing the Marine Corps League, presented a Distinguished Citizen Medal posthumously to George Kelly, Past Commander of VFW Post 3830.

The certificate reads, "The Commandant and members of Camp Tarawa Detachment, #1255, take pride in presenting the Distinguished Citizen Medal to George Kelly, Past Commander, VFW Post 3830.

"Marine George Kelly was a Vietnam veteran who carried his Marine can-do spirit into civilian life and completed a record of volunteer achievement in East Hawaii that was emblematic of the level of devotion and professional service deserving of the title "Distinguished Citizen". Therefore, I do hereby award him the Marine Corps League Bronze Distinguished Citizen Medal (posthumously) and direct that subject award be delivered to VFW Post 3830 respectfully requesting the Post display it in honor of their distinguished past commander's many public service accomplishments." The award is dated 17 August 2013 and signed by Norman S. Stahl for the Commandant. The certificate is displayed at the Post.






